The Year of Alpha Therapy

Australian researchers are about to start work on a clinical trial to test the effectiveness of a new nuclear medicine known as 'Alpha Therapy'. The treatment is up to 100 times more powerful than LuPSMA and could improve outcomes for men with metastatic prostate cancer who do not respond to LuPSMA and other therapies. Many men experience no side effects with the treatment.

Research is key: Price of care highlights need for support

Australian health system expenditure on prostate cancer has hit \$1.35b annually, making it the nation's most costly single disease to treat. The figures highlight the increasing impact of prostate cancer on Australian men, and have prompted a call for improvements in early detection, more timely treatment of disease, and a government focus on prostate cancer as a national research priority.

Pandemic pains: Hundreds of prostate cancers MIA

New data released by the Victorian Cancer Registry has found more than 600 Victorian men may not know they have potentially lethal prostate cancers. The data has prompted an urgent call for men to get a prostate cancer check-up. The figures were published in the latest 'Cancer in Victoria' report, identifying a possible correlation with the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.
